Coordinators Teleconference

Jim explained that all was good to go regarding the contracts. There are minor changes that need to be done to the budget but the budget is concluded. Jim continued about the Fall Series and said that he had sent the link via email. Although this series is directed for the Judicial side; all can attend. Regarding the data system Five Points, there is conversation about getting rid of Five Points all together as there is displeasure with the data being collected from Five Points.

Surcharge Discussion

Coordinators put together a letter to the State in addition to the application for FY 22-24. There is conversation about the counties using the surcharge money that they put into the surcharge account. Campbell County has put in \$28,305.23. All are in favor of this. Additional there is conversation about Judge Phillips overseeing the fees. The board asked questions such as if the judge is better at collecting the fee or assessing the fees. Jim acknowledged that this is a good question, and he will see if he can find out more information. Jim said that he and Chad discussed that if the counties were able to use the money that the counties put into the surcharge, then 75% would go to Adult Treatment Court and 25% to Juvenile Family Drug Court. Jim said that the funding panel meets on September 9, 2022, to vote on the surcharge.

Mentors for JFDC Participants

There has been discussion a couple of weeks ago regarding having ATC graduates to serve as mentors to the JFDC participants. Matt Sheehan has shown to be good support for a couple of the participants as he provides rides and support for our YITs. The board would need to sign off on this, the mentors would be voluntary, and a policy/procedure would need to be written. There were questions such as who would run such program, the vetting process would need to be in depth and would need to ensure that the mentors are living a substance abuse and crime free lifestyle. There would be questions such as where this mentor in sobriety, maturity, and life is. It was then explained towards the end of this conversation that it wouldn't be as much of a program as it would be just for support.

Budget Update

The FY 2022 funding is being updated and closed. The budget worksheet will be updated and sent via email as soon as it is finished. Attached to the Agenda is the FY 23 CST invoice and FY 23 budget worksheet. The CST invoice was made different to make it easier to transfer funds if needed. Jim explained that there will be additional lines in the budget worksheet for Diversion and the YES House but these are not apart of the JFDC budget. These lines will be added to just keep track of the funds and nothing more.

Trainings

Jim discussed that the training series will be from August to November of this year and that there are 2 sessions a month. Jim also inquired about the cost of what it would take to get Jermaine Galloway, "Tall Cop", to come to Gillette sometime next in 2023. Jermaine replied: "My fees for a training where I come in the day before and out the following day after the training is \$6,000 speaking and travel fees as I make my own travel. This would be a 3-3.5 hour training depending on the flights out of the area. I would most likely come into Rapid or Casper for the better flights. If you wanted to do an all day training from 9-4pm that fee would be \$7500 total speaking and travel fees as I would fly out the next morning. To add in a community scan that is an additional \$1600 total. As I would check a few spots in the city I fly into along with Gillette also as some of your locals do go through there to travel." Jim thought that if a few agencies in the community got together than the cost could be shared. DaNece Day explained that she is the President of the Community Health Foundation Board and she knows that they are willing to make this happen. JSP, Campbell County School District, Yes House, City of Gillette, and Prevention Coalition, are all agencies that can meet up and discuss about if they want to participate in bring Jermaine Galloway to Gillette.

JFDC MOU for FY23

Jim passed around a MOU that needed to be signed by members of the board. This is done every year. Nothing has really changed.

Other Business

Last business is renewing the contract for the treatment providers. These will be reviewed and signed by providers.
