Coordinators Teleconference

The last coordinators call took place on August 8, 2022. Jim reminded the board that he sent an email to the board/team regarding the Fall Series. Jim explained that there were apologies passed down from CST due to there not being any certificates being sent out to the members that attended the May training. It has since been corrected and certificates have been and/or will be sent out. There has been conversation about JFDC being moved from under the Wyoming Department of Health and moved over to the Judicial Branch. This decision is in limbo and there could be a possible answer by October-November 2022.

Surcharge Discussion

Since the discussion has been brought up about the different counties keeping the money, they themselves put into the surcharge. The funding panel plans to have further discussion about this topic on September 8, 2022. If it is decided that each county keep the funds they put into the surcharge, then there will have to be a separate policy and procedure drawn up. It was also asked if the DOC would be involved and if so, what would be their role in this.

NADCP Follow-Up

On August 10, 2022, there was an email sent out. There is discussion about having a formalized orientation for any new JFDC members. There are ideas that were brought up about having the new member sit down and meet with the other board members, find out what their roles are, what kind of services are provided through the program, attend a JFDC court hearing to see how it is ran. There should be an expectation that the new member attends a JFDC Court Hearing within the first 30 days. The welcoming should be interactive as well.

Jammie Walker, one of the attendees of the NADCP training stated that she had learned a lot from her training classes that she joined. She stated that one of the classes involved Jermaine, the Tall Cop in which Jammie Walker enjoyed. During the trainings, Jammie Walker stated that she learned more about drug trends and even about how men process through trauma of their own. A woman from Dateline NBC was present as well. She had written a book about her alcoholic dad and spoke about the ability of there being fun and humor during recovery. There was also a film festival. There was a short film that Jammie watched called "To Leslie" that will be released in October 2022. It was about a person winning the lottery, being an addict, and losing everything. There was also discussion of Capital Recovery and how we can keep them sober. There is also a book that Jammie found interesting. It is Sesame Street themed. It is a book that shows people on how to talk to little children that have incarcerated parents.

Budget Update

Jim told the board that JFDC focuses on utilizing the funds from the COVID money and CJSB first. Jim also brought up an issue with an invoice from the YES House regarding one of our participants. There was an invoice sent to JFDC regarding services from January to May 2022 in the amount of \$5700.00. It appeared that insurance was billed and denied the charges as their policy changed in January 2022. The services were reissued to insurance again and they denied the charges again. The invoice was not received by the YES House until after July 25, 2022, in which at that time the FY22 was already closed out. Jim spoke with Ryan, Tatyana, the Grant Specialist Kristen, Alicia, and Char. This situation got taken care and it was explained that JFDC will be unable to pay. Had this invoice came in prior to July 25, 2022, there would have been no issue. It was discussed about using the COVID funds for this invoice, but Jim explained how the COVID funds has been dedicated to 3 JFDC Participants already. In further discussion between Jim Lyon and the YES House it was determined that the invoice for services will be sent to JFDC monthly and will show any charges for services that need to be paid and show any charges pending through insurance. Bonnie asked as to why the invoice cannot be paid with this year's money and it was explained that services done in FY22 are unable to be paid with funds from FY23. JR Bailey also brought up how the invoice shows services starting on 1/3/22, however the participant didn't join the JFDC program until 1/28/22, so it was recommended that there be more attention to detail with this invoice.

Trainings

Jim reminded that the training series has started, and he has emailed the team/board the link for this. This training is for anyone that wants to be apart of it. Jim said that he had brought up Jermaine Galloway during JSP Friday. Clark with the YES House brought up with the YES House being a nonprofit organization, then maybe there is a grant that the YES House can apply for to get Jermaine in Gillette. Jim figured that it would be a great opportunity for Galloway to come to Gillette around the Prevention Summit in April but after following up with Jermaine via email, he is booked out and is

unavailable during this time. There is a time frame for May 2023, and it was mentioned maybe having ½ day geared for parents. Per Galloway, his Springtime is almost book. The time in May that is available is 5/3/2023. The fee to get Galloway here remains the same as discussed at the last meeting. If not May 2023, it was discussed possibly having Galloway here in the beginning of Fall/school year in September 2023. There are also training opportunities through NADCP online that are free. Jim sent this through email as well.

Provider Contracts for FY23

Jim explained that 3 provider contracts for the YES House, Step Stone Counseling, and Counseling Connections LLC were drawn up and signed again for this new FY.

Other Business

The other business being discussed today is about a teenager that has failed 3 UA's and the results have shown to be below 5 on the creatinine. The lab found that this urine used was nonhuman with added THC in it. Megan and Bob had gone to one of the shops in town and bought a bottle of what is claimed to be a detox. For the 12 hour it cost \$25 and there is a \$45 detox that is based on weight, and then there is a Complete Detox that costs \$30. There are items such as bongs, pipes, edibles, and so much more. Jim passed around the bottle of detox so everyone on the board could see it.
