The new Residential Fee-Waived Requirements will be effective January 1, 2018. From October 16, 2017 to January 1, 2018, the current fee-waived allowance of two free dumps per month with a current utility bill will remain in effect.

CHAPTER 9 RULES
SOLID WASTE AND RECYCLING
Effective Date October 16, 2017

Approved and Adopted 10-3-17

Definitions

"CARE" is the Campbell County Amalgamated Recycling Enterprise located at the South Landfill.

"C&D" is construction and demolition waste which is defined by WDEQ as inert waste that includes, but is not limited to, stone, clean wood, concrete, asphaltic concrete, cinder blocks, brick, plaster, sheetrock and metal. C&D waste cannot contain any hazardous materials, MSW, cardboard, tires, treated lumber, friable asbestos, or liquid of any kind.

"Clean Wood" is separated lumber, pallets, and wooden spools. Clean wood does not include any wood that has paint, stain, or pressure/creosote treatment and does not include railroad ties. Clean wood materials mixed with other construction debris will be considered construction demolition and will incur full tipping fees.

"Commercial MSW" is MSW delivered by a commercial carrier, private contractor, municipality or other for-profit commercial enterprise.

"Commercial Quantity Recyclables" means recyclables delivered by individuals, companies, Town of Wright, City of Gillette and commercial carriers for which payment is received for pickup/delivery; or, any recyclables that are dumped onto a tipping floor in any building at the CARE Center, requiring additional labor by recycle staff.

"Household Waste" is MSW or C&D, generated and delivered by the owner of a residential property in Campbell County in a car/SUV, pickup, or pickup with trailer. Items listed under Miscellaneous Rates in the Rate section of this document are not considered Household Waste and will be charged a fee to dump if a fee is listed.

"Hydrocarbon Contaminated Soils" (HCS) are also referred to as PCS or petroleum contaminated soils. These are soils containing petroleum contamination from oil wells, leaking underground tanks or other sources. Special rules and requirements apply for disposal of these soils.

"MSW" is Municipal Solid Waste which is defined by WDEQ as solid waste resulting from, or incidental to, residential, community, trade or business activities, including garbage, rubbish, dead animals and all other solid waste other than construction and demolition, industrial or hazardous waste.

"North Landfill" is the north landfill property, located on North Highway 59 near the Basin Electric Dry Fork Station power plant. Property includes Landfill 2 (Phase I, Phase II, Phase III East, and Phase III West MSW cells), Landfill 3 (C&D cells), tire pile, clean wood pile, and North Landfill Shop.

"North Landfill Road" is the access road from Highway 59 into the North Landfill property. This road is the access to the County Rawhide Facility, North Landfill Scale House, and the North Landfill.

"North Landfill Scale House" is the new scale house servicing the three new public scales on the North Landfill Road. Address is 20 North Landfill Road.

"Residential Quantity Recyclables" means recyclables delivered to CARE Center by individuals or non-profit groups for which no payment has or will be received for pickup/delivery. Quantities are generally smaller and must be placed in the respective designated recyclable bins or locations by the individual or group.

"Secured and Covered Load" means providing tarping and tying to ensure that no loose materials fly out of the vehicle in route to the landfill. A fee will be charged for loads arriving at the scale house without adequate tarping and tying.

"South Landfill" is the 909 Westover Road site, including Building A (baler), Building B (CARE), Recycle building, metal pile, Hazardous Waste building, South Landfill Scale House, and Landfill #1.

"South Landfill Scale House" is the existing scale house located at South Landfill. Address is 909 Westover Road.

North Landfill

Location

North Landfill Road, 11 miles north of Gillette (from the US 14-16/Skyline Drive Intersection at Tower's West Lodge) on Highway 59 North (near Dry Fork Station Power Plant)

Hours of Operation

Monday – Friday: 7:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
Saturday: 11:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.
Sunday: closed

The North Landfill will not accept any commercial trucks after 4:30 p.m. M-F and 4:00 p.m. Saturday. The North Landfill will be closed on County designated holidays and may be closed due to inclement weather. Please contact Campbell County Solid Waste for further information on such closures.

Materials Accepted for Disposal

1. Commercial MSW
2. C&D
3. Household Waste
4. Hydrocarbon Contaminated Soil (Please see section below for more information)
5. Clean Wood
6. Commercial, bulk and public tires
7. Commercial poly pipe
8. Yard waste (grass, branches, leaves) (We recommend taking to the City free of charge)
9. Trailer houses (must be empty)

Prohibited Materials

1. Metal (must be taken to the South Landfill)
2. Refrigerators, freezers and AC units (must be taken to the South Landfill)
3. Household and regulated quantities of hazardous waste (must be taken to South Landfill)
4. Pesticide containers not cleaned, crushed, or opened
5. Drums not emptied, cleaned, or opened
6. PCB or Dioxin-containing solid waste
7. Friable asbestos
8. Motor Vehicles (cars and trucks)
9. Recyclables (must be taken to the CARE Center at South Landfill)

Commercial Carrier Opportunity

Commercial Carriers may be able to take advantage of a commercial-only scale and electronic kiosk allowing quick scaling and entry to the landfill, with no scaling on the way out. Carrier vehicles will need to be pre-registered and tared to utilize this service. Please contact Campbell County Solid Waste for details on the service.

South Landfill

Location

909 Westover Road, Gillette Wyoming

Hours of Operation

Monday – Friday: 10:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday: closed

The South Landfill will not accept commercial deliveries of recyclables after 5:30 p.m. M-F. The South Landfill will be closed on County designated holidays and may be closed due to inclement weather. Please contact Campbell County Solid Waste for further information on such closures.

Materials and Recyclables Accepted for Disposal

1. Commercial and Residential Quantity Recyclable materials. (Please see following section on the CARE Recycling program to determine what items are accepted.)
2. Household Hazardous Waste:
 - a. Household cleaners
 - b. Pesticides/herbicides
 - c. Oil based paint (no latex paint will be received*)
 - d. Spray paint
 - e. Rechargeable batteries
 - f. Used clean engine oil (residential quantity only)
 - g. Car batteries
3. Refrigerators, freezers and AC units (there is a fee for these items)
4. Steel (swing sets, bikes, filing cabinets, desks, water heaters, washers, dryers, ovens, scrap steel, etc.)
5. Residential quantity ash (from stoves and fireplaces)

*To dispose of latex paint, open the cans and allow the paint to dry completely. It can then be disposed of as MSW at the North Landfill.

Prohibited Materials

1. All items not listed above are prohibited for disposal at South Landfill

Campbell County Amalgamated Recycle Center

(CARE)

The following materials will be received at the CARE center located at the South Landfill. These materials must be delivered in a pre-sorted, clean and dry condition. Hours of operation are Monday through Friday from 10:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m. **The CARE center is closed on Saturday and Sunday.** Accepted recyclables are subject to change, so please contact Campbell County Solid Waste periodically for current information.

Residential Quantity Recyclables accepted:

1. #1 PETE plastic (water, soda and energy drink bottles)
2. #2 HDPE colored (detergent, shampoo and lotion bottles)
3. #2 HDPE natural (milk and water containers)
4. Aluminum (soda and beer cans)
5. Tin cans (soup, vegetable and tuna cans)
6. Clean cardboard (corrugated and paste board)
7. Mixed paper (phone books, catalogs, junk mail, envelopes and magazines)
8. Newspaper
9. Office/copy paper

Commercial Quantity Recyclables accepted:

1. Clean corrugated cardboard (up to 5% pasteboard i.e. cereal boxes/soft drink boxes)
2. Office/copy white paper (no shreds)
3. Newspaper
4. Mixed paper (phone books, magazines, junk mail, envelopes, library and text books)

CARE Rates

Residential Quantity Recycling

- Free of charge

Commercial Quantity Recycling

- \$40/ton for clean, dry, sorted recyclables
- \$75/ton for contaminated or wet loads prior to dumping (loads will be sent to North Landfill)
- \$150/ton) for contaminated or wet loads after dumping
- \$10,000 annual fee payable by City of Gillette on July 1st of each year

Residential Fee-Waived Requirements

1. Campbell County residents will be allowed twelve (12) fee-waived dumps of Household Waste per calendar year, per valid Campbell County residential address. The fee-waived balance resets each year on January 1st; unused dumps will not roll over to the following year.
2. Requirements for fee-waived eligibility are as follows:
 - a. Proof of Campbell County residency must be provided by one of the following methods:
 - i. Current vehicle registration with owner's name and valid physical Campbell County residential address matching the driver's license name and physical Campbell County residential address. **Note that the vehicle registration must match the vehicle delivering the Household Waste**
 - ii. Utility bill (current or previous month) with owner's name and valid physical Campbell County residential address matching the driver's license name and valid physical Campbell County residential address
 - iii. If vehicle registration and utility bills only show a post office box, some other form of documentation confirming a valid physical residential Campbell County address will be required
 - b. Only Household Waste will be accepted
 - c. No Commercial MSW or C&D is eligible
 - d. Maximum weight per load cannot exceed one-ton (2000 lbs.). Weight that exceeds one-ton will be charged at the current tipping fee

Hydrocarbon Contaminated Soil (HCS)

1. The North Landfill will accept HCS year-round (weather permitting). The soil may require special testing. Please contact Campbell County Solid Waste at (307) 682-9499 prior to bringing this material. Once the soil has been approved for disposal, twenty-four (24) hour notice is required prior to delivery.
2. Arrangements for payment must be made prior to delivery. Campbell County Solid Waste accepts credit cards or you may complete a credit application to apply for a charge account. Applications for credit must be submitted at least two (2) weeks prior to the time waste will be brought to our facility.
3. We are a Wyoming Department of Environmental Quality Solid Waste permitted facility. All wastes are required to pass a paint filter test. If there are any free liquids (i.e. water, oil, diesel or gasoline) or any hazardous wastes, we will not accept the load.
4. Campbell County reserves the right to require the completion of additional forms, including a Statement of Responsibility and/or a Contaminated Soil Record form.

General Requirements and Information

1. Before bringing anything to either landfill, your loads need to be sorted
2. All loads must be secured and tarped. Failure to do so will result in a \$25 residential fee, and a \$50 commercial fee, added to your total
3. All wastes are required to pass a paint filter test and must not contain any free liquids or hazardous wastes
4. At North Landfill Scale House, pull onto the scale slowly, stop, and interact with the scale house attendant
5. Dispose of all loads as directed by Campbell County Solid Waste staff
6. When disposing of boats, lawn equipment and motorcycles, make sure all fluids have been drained prior to bringing them to the landfill
7. Children and pets must remain in your vehicle at all times
8. Salvaging of material from the landfill or recycling center is prohibited
9. Be aware that when transporting waste to the North Landfill, you may be subject to City litter ordinances while in town and State litter Laws on US14-16 and Highway 59. In addition, uncovered and unsecured loads

will incur a fee at the landfill. Please help us keep our roadways clean and litter free by securing and covering your loads

³ Includes waste delivered in a vehicle with license plates other than 17- County unless current vehicle registration ties the vehicle and owner to a valid Campbell County residential address.

⁴ All untarped or unsecured loads will be assessed a \$25.00 fee. Payment must be made prior to dumping unsecured load at either landfill. Upon payment of the first Uncovered Load Fee, resident will receive an 8'x10' tarp for use in covering future loads. Subsequent Uncovered Load violations will not receive a tarp.

⁵ We are permitted to accept waste from Campbell, Converse, Crook, Johnson, Natrona, Niobrara, Sheridan, and Weston counties.

All fees and charges must be paid at the time of delivery of a load unless a credit application has been completed and approved by Campbell County Solid Waste. If approved, all invoices must be paid within thirty (30) days. Failure to pay within thirty (30) days, will result in a five dollar (\$5) per day late fee being charged to your account. Failure to pay your account within sixty (60) days will result in your account being closed and use of the landfill will be terminated until your account is paid in full. If collection efforts are initiated by Campbell County Solid Waste to collect past due accounts, you will be responsible for all fees, charges and attorney fees incurred.

NOTE: Cash, checks and credit cards will be accepted at the South and North Landfill scale house facilities.
